REDEFINING CLOVER...

Clover, doing the heavy lifting: White clover is the backbone of Clover Plus, drawing in pollinators, fixing nitrogen and keeping the lawn green through dry spells better than grass alone.

A little extra: A small proportion of companion species, including bird's-foot-trefoil, black medick and selfheal, add pockets of colour and extend pollinator interest through the season.

Feeds the soil: Clover draws nitrogen from the air into the soil, and the mix's other legume species, tufted vetch and black medick, add to the effect, helping reduce the need for synthetic fertiliser over time.

Cut less, see more: Mowing every 2 to 3 weeks is enough to keep Clover Plus looking its best, and it's ideal for No Mow May and Let It Bloom June.

Built to be used: Family-friendly and capable of standing up to everyday garden life, without losing its visual appeal.

Lower input, not no input: No pesticides, weedkiller or fertilisers needed to establish colour and structure, for a lawn that asks less of you and the environment.

The established percentage of grass to wildflowers will depend on the maintenance regime. More frequent mowing will result in fewer wildflowers and conversely, less frequent mowing means the wildflowers will come to dominate.
